Question: Explain the four competing theories of American government. By examining various historical and contemporary aspects of our government (i.e. the question of the Constitution and torture; a critical analysis of the problem of inequality; and the future of higher education), create an overall thesis suggesting which of the four appears to be the more descriptive with regard to the "necessary and ordinary operations of American government."

- III. Main Body (beginning with page number 3)
 - a. Introduction / Thesis Statement a brief description of the four theories followed by a brief statement of your thesis outlining the details of how you will explore this overall question (2 to 3 pages in length).
 - b. The Constitution and torture. Is the policy guided by law or power? (first research project approximately 7 pages).
 - c. The problem of inequality. A government responding to the needs of working families? (second research project [Mace's paper] approximately 7 pages).
 - d. The US mass media. Watchdog or lapdog? (Optional extra credit project [5% added to final class percentage] approximately 7 pages).
 - e. The future of higher education. Will it be worth the cost? (third research project approximately 7 pages).
 - f. Conclusion a wrap-up of your thesis and the conclusions that you have come to based on the evidence you have uncovered (2 to 3 pages in length).
