### **Instructions for the Week of November 2 to 6**

**People!**

How's everybody? OK, let's continue our conversation on the adolescent and society, focusing on how society views this period in life, it's positives and negatives. We'll also finish up our film on how poverty affects adolescence, often times making a tough period in life even more challenging. Your workload for the week looks like this:

**Task 1:** Click "PowerPoint Notes for The Adolescent in Society" and finish up slides 20 – 45. After going through this part of the presentation, I would like everyone to write two questions and make two comments about the presentation. You will upload this information to our Google Classroom page.

**Task 2:** Click "Text Reading and Text Assignment # 12" to find out what to read that week and the accompanying text assignment. This text assignment will be uploaded to the Google Classroom page.

**Task 3:** Click "Crash Course # 20: Adolescence." These short, 8 to 12-minute videos are a great way to familiarize yourself with some of the concepts we use in sociology. Nicole's gonna tell you about adolescence (although she ain't much older than you!).

**Task 4:** Each lecture will be accompanied by an article which will correspond to that lecture's theme. This week you'll be reading "Remote Learning Makes Punishment Easier Than Connection." No journal response this week, but I would like to hear your thoughts on it during Zoom.

**Task 5:** Click "Video: Growing Up Poor in America" and watch the last 30 minutes. The videos are approximately one to two hours for each lecture. They can be watched at your convenience but do try to absorb the entire film. After watching the film, you will go to our Google Classroom page and upload to the Discussion Board Response. On this page I would like you to write a short, one-paragraph comment about the film. After that, please respond to two other student's responses. Please keep your responses to other students respectful – we don't need to agree, but let's be polite and mature in how we talk to each other...
