Instructions for the Week of February 16 to 19

Task 1: Click "PowerPoint Notes for The Family" and go over slides 1 – 21. After going through this part of the presentation, I would like everyone to write two questions and make two comments about the presentation. You will upload this information to our Google Classroom page.

Task 2: Click "Text Reading and Text Assignment # 7" to find out what to read that week and the accompanying text assignment. This text assignment will be uploaded to the Google Classroom page.

Task 3: Click "Crash Course # 37: Theories of Family and Marriage." These short, 8 to 12-minute videos are a great way to familiarize yourself with some of the concepts we use in sociology. Nicole will take us on a family tour.

Task 4: Each lecture will be accompanied by an article which will correspond to that lecture's theme. This week will require you to upload a "journal response" to the article. Remember, one *full* page for the full 10 out of 10 points credit and make sure to analyze, not summarize (don't tell me what the article is *about* (summarizing), tell me what you *think* about it (analysis).

Task 5: Click "Video: When Did Marriage Become About Love?" and watch. After watching the film, you will go to our Google Classroom page and upload to the Discussion Board Response. On this page I would like you to write a short, one to two-paragraph comment about the film. After that, please respond to two other student's responses. Please keep your responses to other students respectful – we don't need to agree, but let's be polite and mature in how we talk to each other...
