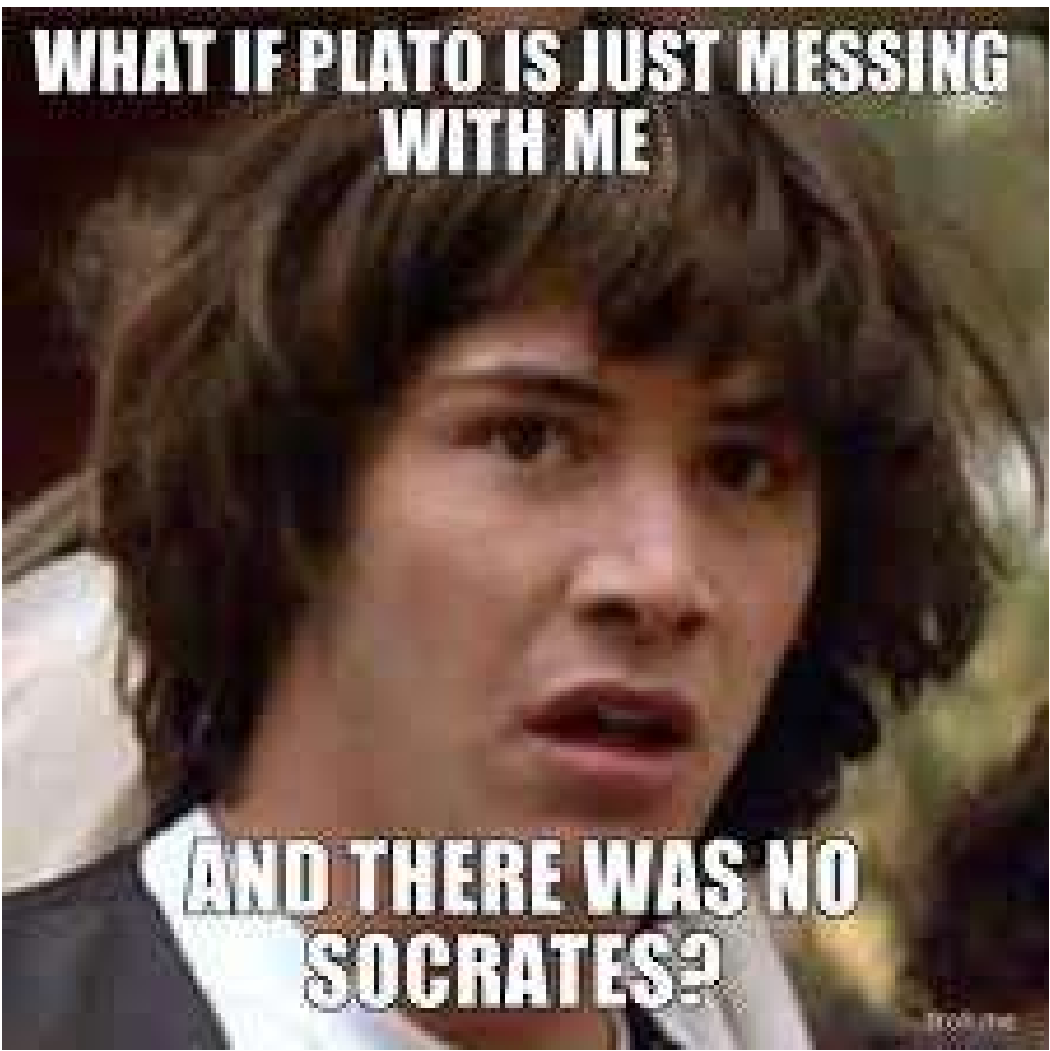
Task 5: Open the link for the video and begin watching all the excerpts for the documentary *What is Democracy?* (Plato and Aristotle would have *loved* this film!).
