

Instructions for the November 17, 2020 Lecture

So friends we have just three more weeks left. The paper is due tonight. It's gotta be in, no exceptions. Make sure you've edited your paper! Sloppy analysis, spelling and grammar mistakes, and technical APA errors are going to lower your grade on the first draft. You should be aiming to get as high a grade as you can on the first draft so that your grade average between the two turn-ins will be above 90%. This week we'll start looking at two important (I think the most important, even considering what's going on in the country right now) policies the government must address: economics and foreign policy. Task 2: Read Chapter 13 in the Heineman text (pp. 265-285)

Task 3: Watch the lecture presentation for "U.S. Economic Policy." I will be your tour guide.

Task 4: Read the article for your journal response "40 Years of Economic Policy in One Chart" by Mike Whitney. You can find the question on the link titled "Lecture / Discussion Page" highlighted in yellow. After completing the response, you will have until the date posted on the assignments page to upload it to Canvas.

Task 5: Open the link for the video and watch *How the Rich Get Richer: Money in the World Economy*. A superb documentary from DW examining US-led financial wrongdoings, escalating inequality, and how governments around the world, not just in the US, are probably making things worse.

Task 6: Click the link titled "Discussion Board Question and Peer Responses for Video Presentation" and answer the question that I have posted in approximately one paragraph or so. Wait for other students to put their responses and then pick two students to respond to. The deadline for these responses will be posted on the Canvas assignments page. Don't be late....
