

Instructions for the Lecture Two

Task 4: Read the article for your journal response ([link](#)). You can find the question on the link titled “Lecture / Discussion Page” highlighted in yellow. After completing the response, you will have until the date posted on the assignments page to upload it to Canvas.

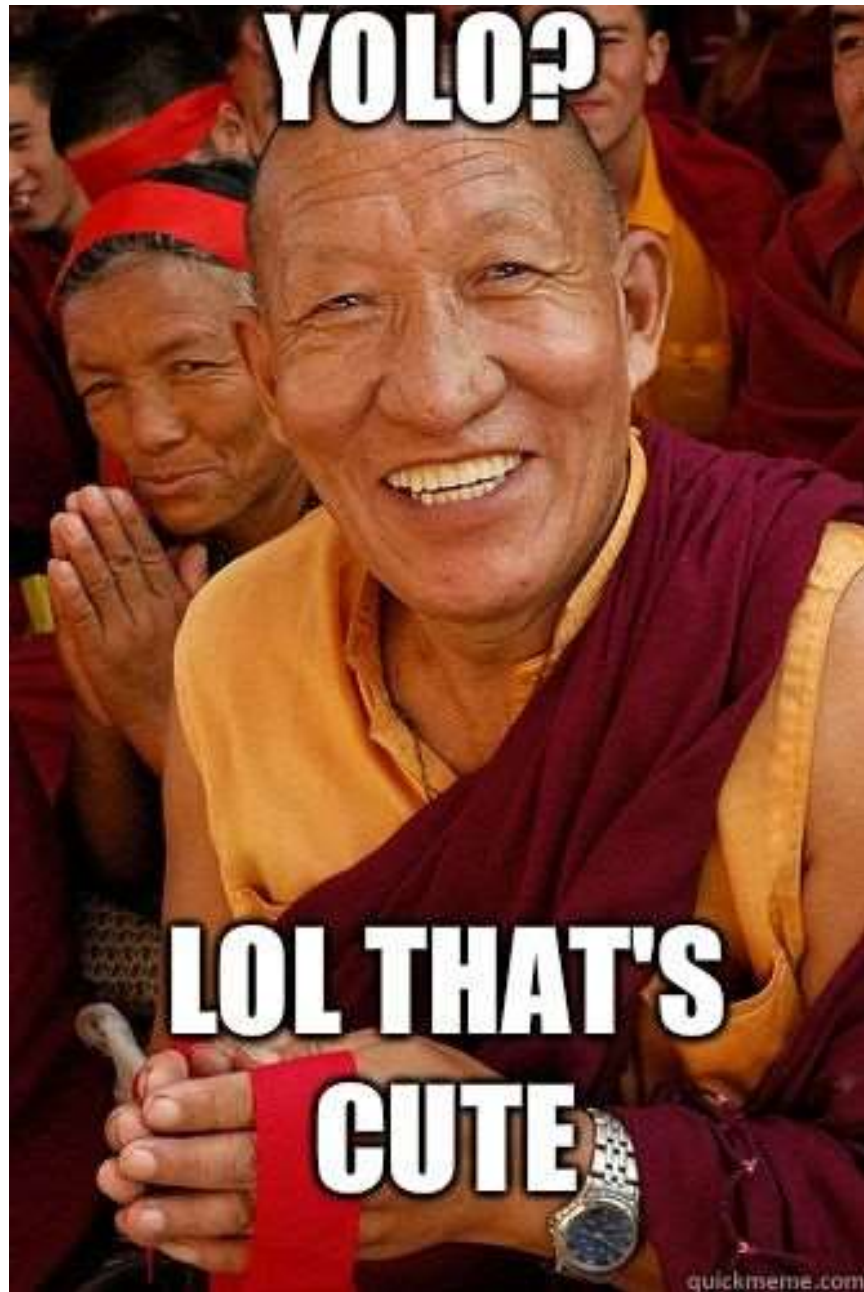
Task 5: Open the link for the video and watch *The Lottery of Birth*.
