4. Of the five theoretical approaches to security, which do *you* think our foreign and defense policies should be formulated upon? (Group discussion and review).5. Discuss the Klare interview on global resource wars. What are the major theoretical underpinnings of his argument?

6. Explain the main arguments being presented in the film *Oil, Smoke and Mirrors*? Do you agree or disagree with the main thrust of their collective arguments about the importance or seeing oil at the core of the 9/11 attacks? What do you believe a realist would say to this? Would you agree? Why or why not?
