

Instructions for the April 17, 2023 Lecture

Well My Friends,

Time for a new unit! It's time to get "contemporary." Yes, we will now look at a few *contemporary* ideologies starting with feminism and ecologism (referred to in the U.S. as "environmentalism" – your textbook authors are Brits). Both of these ideologies have a longer lineage than is commonly understood, so it's hard to call them contemporary. But most scholars talk about them as emerging in the late 20th century, typically around the 1960s / 70s. Still, they probably go back centuries and have animated philosophical discussions as they've evolved. I've combined them (there's 4 total) to save time, but I encourage you to dig deeper on your own if any of these ideologies seem appealing. Here's what you've been waiting for: Your tasks!
